Student Activities for Emirati Day Celebration:

As part of the celebration, students will be engaged in the following educational and creative activities:

1. Drawing famous UAE landmarks such as **Burj Khalifa, Louvre Abu Dhabi, or desert landscapes** using watercolors or colored paper, and writing about the chosen landmark in Arabic.
2. Creating small UAE flags using paper, fabric, or 3D printing.
3. A photo exhibition comparing the UAE's past and present to highlight its progress, along with sentences describing life in the UAE before and now.

4. Displaying pictures of traditional Emirati games such as **Hide-and-Seek, Al-Saqila, or Al-Teela**, and writing about the chosen game.
5. Writing short thank-you messages to the leaders and nation of the UAE.
6. Preparing PowerPoint presentations about the heritage of the UAE with pictures (food, clothing, sports, etc.).
7. Grade 7 and above students will be engaged in competency based activities

Dress Code:
