

Provide opportunities to your ward so that they can recall the situation and answer appropriately in complete sentence. (Tell a story and ask questions).</p> <p><u>LEAF COLLAGE:</u> For a fun letter "L" activity, take your child on a nature walk to collect leaves. Then, draw a large "L" on construction paper and help them glue the leaves around or inside it to create a collage. As you work, talk about the sound of "L" and brainstorm words like "leaf" and "lion." This activity reinforces letter recognition and creativity.</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p><u>MAGIC MILK ACTIVITY:</u> Parents can Pour a small amount of milk in a plate, put a few drops of different food colours</p>



or different paint colours with water. Provide the child with a cotton bud that has been dipped in dish wash soap. Thereafter ask the child to put the cotton bud right into the middle of the plate that has the milk and colours in it. **NOW SEE THE MAGIC UNFURL!!!**

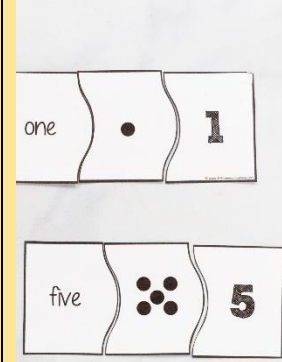

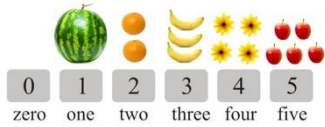

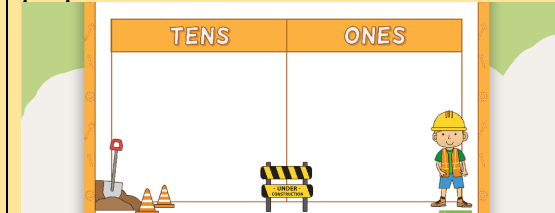

BIRDS/ANIMAL PUPPETS

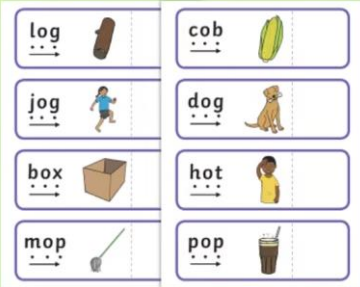

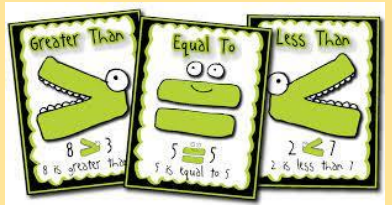

<p>English</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Writing of 2/3 letter words with the vowel 'o'. • Picture comprehension • Reading Comprehension • Toughy turtle 	<p>Activity: Phonemic manipulation Fun games on vowels. The children will be given flash cards with alphabets and will be encouraged to construct common three-letter words like pot, hot, fox, jog etc.</p> <p>Learning Objective: To be able to develop proper vocabulary and language skills with the help of phonics and two and three letter words.</p>	<p>Simple sentences with two/three letter words of vowels such as “o” should be spoken and encouraged at home.</p> <p>“O” VOWEL CRAFT Fox Sock Puppet Word Game: Create a simple fox sock puppet at home using a sock, some felt for ears and nose, and markers for details. Parents can call out CVC words with the vowel 'o' (e.g., hot, fox, mop), and the child uses the fox puppet to "pick" each word from a set of cards or written words.</p> <p>Once all the words are picked, encourage the child to mimic a fox voice and read out each word they found. This playful activity helps reinforce phonics and makes reading fun!</p>

Learning Objective:

Encourage your children to repeat numbers 1-40 every week. Spend half an hour everyday on developing numeracy concept. Revise the work done earlier to strengthen concepts.





DIY Number Sign Cards (<, >, =):

Using cardboard, create simple cards with <, >, and = signs. Make a set of number cards (e.g., 10, 20, 30, etc.). Parents call out two numbers, and the child has to pick and place the correct sign between the two numbers. Encourage them to compare which number is larger or smaller as they do this.




Clothesline Number Match (Number After, Number Between):

Create a "clothesline" using string and paper clips. Write numbers (41-50) on small pieces of paper. Parents call out a number and ask the child to hang the next number ("number after") on the line or place numbers between two given numbers ("number between"). This activity enhances number sequence





ACTIVITIES SCHEDULED FOR THE MONTH (KG-1)

<p>10th October, 2024</p>	<p>World Mental Health Day</p> 	<p>KG-1</p> <p>Awareness will be raised amongst students regarding the importance of being happy and keeping others happy via morning messages, videos/PPT followed by a worksheet.</p> <p>Home Activity:</p> <p>Parents can encourage their child to create a "Feelings Art Collage" using cutouts, drawings, and colors that represent different emotions, highlighting the importance of mental well-being. Additionally, host a family discussion to reinforce the value of kindness and support, emphasizing that sharing feelings is a vital part of maintaining good mental health.</p>
<p>16th October, 2024</p> 	<p>World Food Day</p> 	<p>KG-1</p> <p>Awareness will be raised amongst students about actions that can be taken in our own little way for those who suffer from hunger followed by creative art work</p> <p>Home Activity:</p> <p>Parents can talk to their child about the importance of finishing their meals and not wasting food. Encourage them to share ideas on how to use leftovers creatively, like making a new dish or sharing with someone in need.</p>
<p>17th October, 2024</p>	<p>Math Day</p> 	<p>KG-1</p> <p>Various number games will be organized in order to develop numeracy skill amongst students</p> <p>Home Activity:</p> <p>Parents can organize a "Family Math Game Night" using board games that involve counting, addition, or strategy. Discuss how math is used in games and everyday activities, reinforcing its importance in a fun and engaging way.</p>
<p>24th October, 2024</p>	<p>UN Day</p> 	<p>KG-1</p> <p>Students will be familiarized with the importance of the UN organization. Students will make a poster on the UN day theme as felicitated by the teacher.</p> <p>Home Activity:</p> <p>Parents can discuss with their wards the need for maintaining peace and harmony everywhere.</p>

<p>10th October, 2024</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;">World Mental Health Day</p> 	<p>KG-2 Awareness will be raised amongst students regarding the importance of being happy and keeping others happy via morning messages, videos/PPT. Students will do activities using art and craft materials.</p> <p>Home Activity: Emotion Cards: Create cards with different emotional faces (happy, sad, mad, scared, etc.). Have children pick a card and talk about a time they felt that emotion or share something that makes them feel that way.</p>
<p>16th October, 2024</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">World Food Day</p> 	<p>KG-2 Awareness will be raised amongst students about actions that can be taken in our own little way for those who suffer from hunger. Students will colour the basket and stick the pictures of different food items on the basket depicting "saving of food for all."</p> <p>Home Activity: Parents can create a "Food Waste Diary" with their child to track any food they don't finish during the week. Use this opportunity to discuss hunger and poverty, highlighting the importance of valuing food and finding ways to help those in need.</p>

<p>17th October, 2024</p>	<p>Math Day</p> 	<p>KG-2 Children will be shown how to use the money to buy and sell things similar to what we do in our day-to-day life. Home Activity: Parents can organize a “Family Math Game Night” using board games that involve counting, addition, or strategy. Discuss how math is used in games and everyday activities, reinforcing its importance in a fun and engaging way.</p>
<p>24th October, 2024</p>	<p>UN Day</p> 	<p>KG-2 Students will be familiarized with the importance of the UN organization. Students will make a UN Badge and wear it in order to celebrate the day. Home Activity: Parents can discuss with their ward the need for maintaining peace and harmony everywhere.</p>
