This could be a library book, personal reads, general interests, nonfiction etc. Apple Stamping Apple stamping is a lot of fun. Cut an apple in half, and carve out the shape of the letter "A". Have your child stamp the letter on a sheet of paper and say the "A" sound each time they stamp. The "A" Box Decorate a box with the letter "A". Inside the box place items or pictures of items that begin with the letter "A". This also works well if you use pictures, and have your ward in turn draw out one picture and tell its name. "B" Different! Get pictures of birds, butterflies, bees, bears, and bunniesRead and talk about how they are alike and how they are different. What is big? What is small? Give a lot of opportunities to your ward to speak and understand. They should be given enough time for listening & then time for answering questions. Activities like pick & talk, just a minute, etc. should be encouraged at home.

English	 Pictures and phonic sounds Writing of 2/3letter CVC words with the vowel 'a' Toughy Turtle 	Activity: Through PPT & along with the help of letter flashcards children will revise the phonic sounds of all the letters. Learning Objective: To recall & identify the alphabets & their phonic sounds. Activity: The children will be encouraged to make use of Letter flashcards to construct common three-letter words like cat, map, van, rat, etc. Learning Objectives: To be able to develop proper vocabulary and language skills with the help of phonics and two and three-letter words.	Parents can imbue amongst their kids the habit of reading and making new words with the help of magnetic letters. They can add or change one letter to make a new word. For example, begin with the word "car" and add t/ to the end to make the new word "cat" then take off the /c/ and replace it with a /m/ to make the word "mat" and so on. See how many new words you and your child can make.



and recognize the difference.



Pick & Build

To make your ward understand the meaning of the tens place & one's place provide them with unifix cubes /straws/crayons etc. This will allow them to think about how numbers can be broken apart, put together & rearranged to build a foundation with numbers of 11-19


Learning objective:

Place the two-colored paints for each zip lock bag in the corners opposite each other. One bag with blue and yellow, the second bag with red and blue and the third bag with red and yellow. Use sticky tape to seal and strengthen the squishy bag. Gently ask your ward to press and push the paints to the center of the bag to blend. Using your fingers gently rub the paint to mix and blend. Watch as the colors blend together. Make predictions and talk about what is happening throughout the process to your ward.
