EVENT NAME: BASIC LIFE SUPPORT TRAINING (4th August)

As part of Bone and Joint Day observation, a session was organised on the topic Basic Life Support for the HSG Cadets in the school seminar hall. The faculty was Dr. Sree Ganesh K, an experienced trauma and joint replacement surgeon at Fatima Hospital. He is also the parent of Harigovind S(Grade VI) and Harinita S (Grade II).

He explained that the knowledge of BLS and practice of simple CPR techniques increase the chances of survival of the patient until experienced medical help arrives and, in most cases, is sufficient for survival in itself. The session also included demostrations and video clippings. The important points/steps of BLS were clearly explained- how to begin CPR, use of barrier device, if available, rescue breath etc.



EVENT NAME: HIROSHIMA AND NAGASAKI DAY (9th August)

To make the cadets realize the destruction caused by war and the consequences of the use of nuclear weapons, Our Vidyalaya observed Hiroshima and Nagasaki day on 6th and 9th of August respectively. Cadets were encouraged to peace swans by the students in memory of Japanese girl Sadako, a 12-year-old victim of the disaster. A short speech was given in the school assembly by the program coordinator Ms Gigi about the relevence of observing the day and how important it is to maintain peace and harmony. Cadets also took an oath to promote peace and harmony in this prevailing world of tension and nuclear warfare. The event served to remember and pay homage to the thousands of innocent victims who lost their lives in the bombing of Japan cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki by the Americans. The Scouts and Guides of the school also took part in the Cycle Rally. The rally started from the school

ground and went through the streets of Palluruthy for a total of 5 km before terminating at the same place.



EVENT NAME: INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION (15th August)-

Anand by hoisting the flag. 108 Scouts and Guides (CVK-61, Amala Public School-25, Guardian Angels Public School-22) and 41 teacher trainers took part in it. Sri K S Chauhan, the National Organising Commissioner of HSGA in India was the chief trainer of the camp.
