We encourage all students to participate actively and enthusiastically and become responsible global citizens contributing towards a greener and more sustainable Earth.

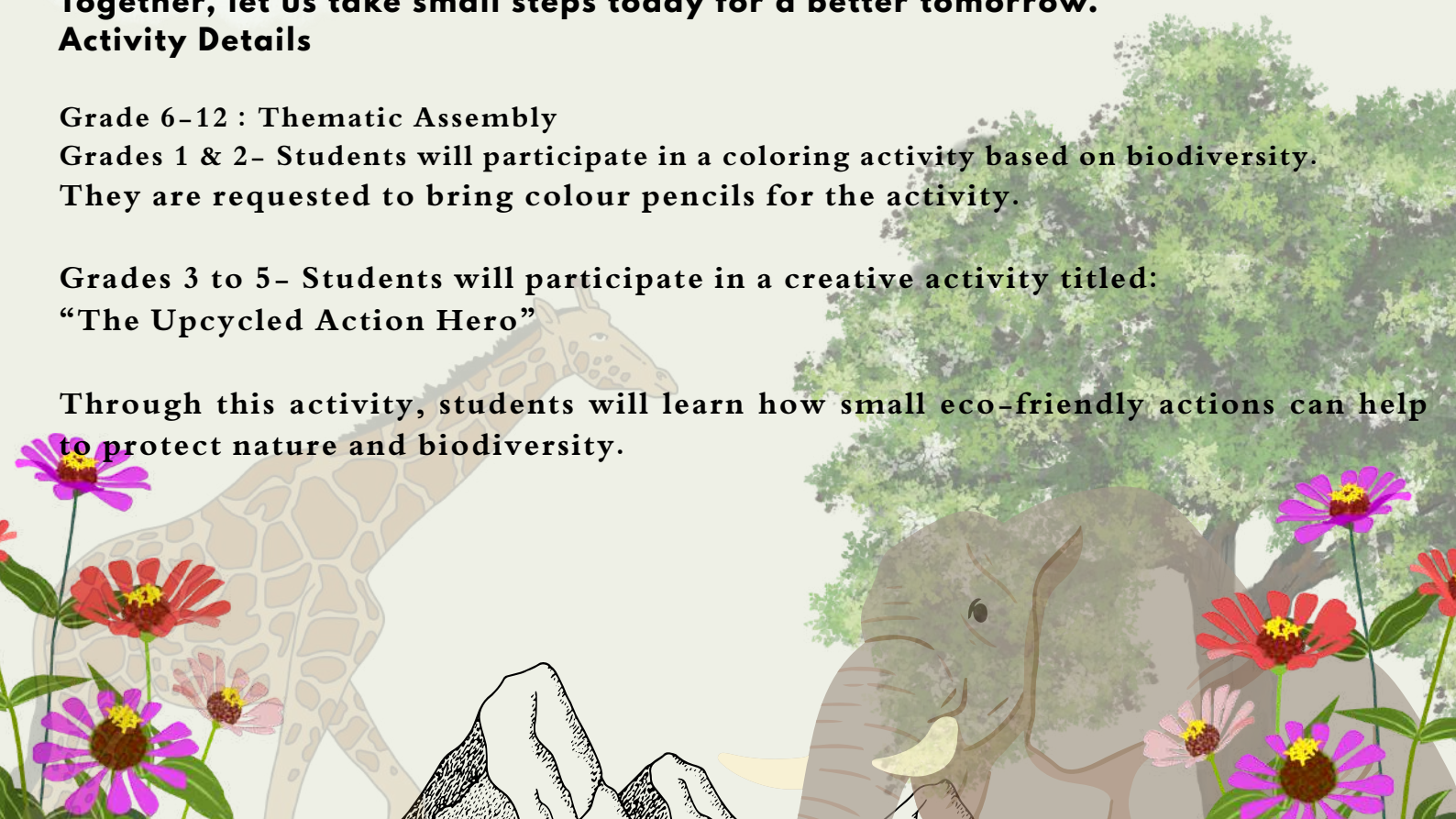
Together, let us take small steps today for a better tomorrow.

Grade 6-12 : Thematic Assembly

**Grades 3 to 5- Students will participate in a creative activity titled:
"The Upcycled Action Hero"**

Through this activity, students will learn how small eco-friendly actions can help to protect nature and biodiversity.



Guidelines:

1. Create Your Hero Identity

Students may create a superhero identity such as:

- * The Water Saver
- * The Recycling Ranger
- * The Plant Protector
- * The Bird Feeder



Students may also draw a simple nature-themed hero emblem.

2. Upcycled Cape Creation

Students are encouraged to use any old reusable material available at home, such as:

- * A pillowcase
- * A paper grocery bag

They may decorate it using colours, paper scraps, and eco-friendly designs.
