### KINDERGARTEN POLICIES & PROCEDURES

*“CHILDHOOD SHOULD BE A JOURNEY NOT A RACE”*

This policy was formulated to

1. Engage and promote each child's abilities in a positive and creative path.
2. Provide utmost physical and emotional stability.
3. Provide an all-round developmental experience.
4. Establish their abilities to learn from and interact with their environment at an early stage.
5. Provide an attractive and inviting environment which focuses on the interest and choices of little children.
6. Provide a pleasant rich and inspiring environment for the children to easily acquire observational, critical thinking and problem solving skills needed in daily life.
7. Stimulate each child's individual need, abilities and interest.
8. Provide comprehensive through assessments of verbal, literacy and children's responses and reactions during projects.
9. Encourage children to be bold and communicate in moments of danger and report appropriately.
10. To enhance children appreciation of the natural world and extend their

learning experiences to stimulate brain activity by using the senses and improve motor activity.

11. To provide opportunity for investigation and inference through sensorial experiences.

## PROCEDURE

1. Age at the time of admission is verified as per the KHDA Regulation: A student applying for KG I must be 4 years as of 31<sup>st</sup> March and for KG II must be 5 years of 31<sup>st</sup> March of the academic year in which they are admitted.
2. Admission test conducted for KG II entrants.
3. Admissions are open by November of the previous years.
4. Entrance tests and interviews are conducted throughout the month. Admissions must be confirmed within the week of notice given, if the parents exceed the time given, the admission is dismissed.
5. In Case when the number of admissions exceed the seats applicable, the students are added to the waiting list .
6. Orientation for parents conducted.
7. Official information is communicated through electronic media and schooldiary.
8. Prior sanction of leave to be obtained.
9. Prolonged absence on medical grounds should be supported by a medical certificate.
10. Uninformed and unauthorized prolonged absence may result in removal or termination.
11. Evaluating their skill development.

8. Original Attested Transfer Certificate
9. Copy of Mark Sheet / Progress Card ( For KG II )

## Withdrawal Procedure

- One month written notice of intention of withdrawal (email or letter) is to be submitted to the Principal.
- For students who are withdrawn from the school during the academic year, fee deduction will take place accordingly.

## Termination Procedure

A student will be terminated by the school on the following grounds

- Long Continuous Absence (up to 30 days) from the school without prior permission from the school authorities and nonpayment of fees.
- Heavy Misconduct
