

Text feetures include all the components of a story or article that are not the main body of text. These include the table of contents, index, glossary, headings, bold words, sidebars, pictures and captions, and labeled diagrams.

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






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Common nouns name any person, place, thing, or idea. They are not capitalized unless they come at the beginning of a sentence.
