*Hope you are doing well and keeping safe.*

As per the directives of the Ministry of Education Ajman, and in line with the commitment to ensure the continuity of the educational process in a safe and well-regulated environment, the Ministry has confirmed that **school bus services will resume effective Monday, 20 April 2026**, across all private schools in the Emirate of Ajman, with full adherence to the approved policies and procedures.

Our school is required to implement **in-person learning**, ensuring strict compliance with all applicable regulations and approved guidelines from the above-mentioned date.

In this regard, we would like to inform you that **all staff will be required to report to school on Monday, 20 April 2026**, to attend essential training sessions for the safe resumption of classes. This training is being conducted in line with the latest Ministry guidelines on the **Phased Resumption of In-Person Education** and is necessary to ensure the readiness of the campus, classrooms, and all safety protocols.

As staff will be engaged in these scheduled training sessions, there will be **no live online classes on Monday, 20 April 2026, for students from KG1 to Grade 12**. However, to ensure continuity of learning, students will be assigned **asynchronous tasks, worksheets, or assignments**, which they are expected to complete and submit to their respective teachers on the same day.

We are currently awaiting final approval from the Ministry and expect to receive the same by Monday, 20 April 2026. Further updates will be shared with you at the earliest based on the approval status.

Additionally, the school has submitted a comprehensive plan to the authorities for a **staggered, section-wise reopening**, tentatively scheduled to begin from **Tuesday, 21 April 2026**, subject to approval.

We sincerely appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we take these necessary steps to ensure a safe and smooth transition back to in-person learning. The safety and well-being of our students remain our highest priority, and we are committed to ensuring that all safety measures are fully in place before welcoming students back to school.
