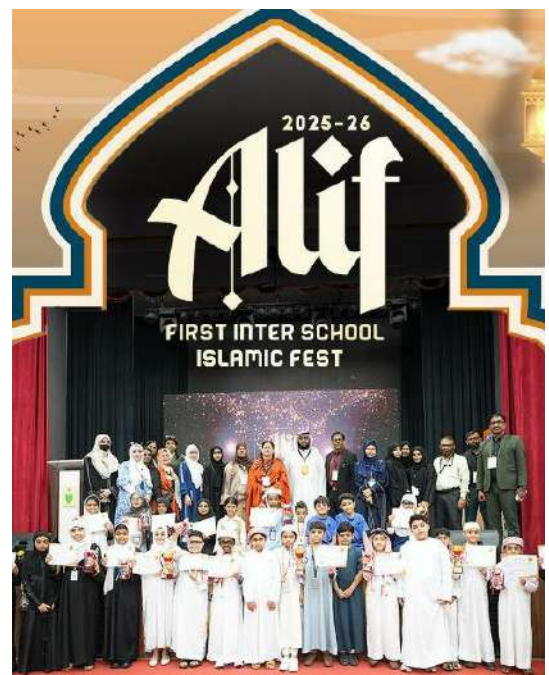


Teacher Enrichment Session: CBSE Hub & Spoke Collaboration

It was an inspiring interaction that strengthened student voice and leadership.



Our Student Council members took the lead in organizing and coordinating a wide range of impactful events and initiatives throughout the academic year 2025–2026.
