Dear Parents,

“Greetings from IIS Family”

Kindly be informed that, in accordance with **Ministerial Decision No. (851) of 2018** regarding the **Student Behavior Management Regulations** (Article 17, Clause 13), students from **KG to Grade XII** are strictly prohibited from bringing mobile phones onto the school campus. This measure is implemented to ensure student safety, privacy, and a focused learning environment.

Parents and students are requested to take note of the Ministry of Education (MOE) guidelines on this matter and ensure full compliance.

The following procedures will be followed:

- Regular inspections will be conducted in a manner that respects student privacy and school regulations.
- Any mobile phone found in a student’s possession will be confiscated as per MOE procedures.
- Parents will be informed immediately and required to sign the relevant forms (Form 24 and Form 25).
- **First Offence:** Mobile phones will be confiscated for one month.
- **Second Offence:** Mobile phones will be confiscated until the end of the academic year.
- Cases involving inappropriate content, including photographs or videos of students or staff, will be referred to the Child Rights Unit for further action.
- Disciplinary measures will be applied in cases where mobile phones are used for unethical, illegal, or disruptive purposes.
- This regulation also applies to all school-sponsored activities, including educational trips, picnics, events, and recreational programmes. Mobile phones are not permitted during such activities.

Important Note to Parents

Parents are requested to discuss this regulation with their children, ensure their compliance, and monitor adherence to the policy. Bringing mobile phones to school is a violation of MOE regulations and may result in disciplinary action. Your cooperation and guidance are essential in helping students avoid unnecessary complications and maintain a safe and disciplined school environment.
